FROM THE DESK OF..... BISHOP NATHAN BAXTER

Dear Friends in Christ:

Recently I found in my mail a post card invitation addressed "To Our Friends At... (our address and zip code followed)". The message was clear and simple, "We would love to have you join us in our commitment to build a church of truth and grace." I am sure this invitation went to all in my zip code. We were being invited to the opening of a new church plant of the Anglican Church in North America. This is the body representing a number of break-away bodies going back at least to 1928 (the Reformed Episcopal Church broke away for reasons including the new 1928 BCP and the Anglo-Catholic Movement). Of course the most recent would be congregations largely from the Diocese of Pittsburgh. This postcard reminded me of several things:

First, it was a good example of evangelism. The notice was simple and attractive with a clear message. There was no blatant baggage and language felt welcoming. This has not always been so here and in other dioceses. We have experienced appeals to the public based on anti-Episcopal Church bias as recent as this winter. In the most extreme case we have responded with correction to the message but never to their right to exist.

Second, I expect that in the near future we will see other such efforts in other parts of our diocese. In fact, there have been alternative Anglican congregations in some of our communities for years. In this regard we should keep one another (especially the bishop) aware of such developments for information sake.

Third, we should be encouraged to keep advancing our own local evangelism efforts, keeping our communities aware of our local witness of Jesus Christ, our desire to know neighbors and welcome them into our congregation, whether for a special event or our ongoing life we must keep them aware we are there and we care.

Fourth, as a diocese we are discerning where and how we strength our existing "new plant" and where (based on demographics) we might renew a "missions" or develop other new ministries.

Fifth, we should reassure our congregations not to be fearful or hostile as alternative Anglican efforts develop. Other main-line bodies such as Presbyterians, Lutherans, Baptist and those of Wesleyan traditions have lived for generations with various strands of their traditions existing in their communities. We should keep active our ministries, evangelism and show the best of Christian love and Anglican comprehensiveness.

Finally, join me in re-reading the nurturing directive of St. Paul's admonition to the Church at Philippi (4:8, 9).
