FROM THE DESK OF..... BISHOP NATHAN BAXTER

Dear Friends in Christ;

During my visitations I am often asked, from which Churches or Traditions do we present persons to be Received and from which do we present persons for Confirmation. Let me first state that full membership in any Episcopal congregation is baptism, whether done in an Episcopal or other Church or Christian community. The only criteria here are material evidence of that baptism and that it has been done in the Trinitarian formula. Confirmation is a time of public affirmation of commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord and formally offering one's self for ministry, all before the gathered congregation and the bishop.

Historic Recognition: In our sacramental tradition and belief a bishop, acting as chief pastor in Apostolic Succession, lays hands upon all members praying empowerment for Christian service ("Empower him/her for your service"). Implicitly confirmation is also an acknowledgement of the emphasis we place on Apostolic Succession, much as is done at ordination of clergy. This is also evident in the Book of Common Prayer which guides that the bishop, as chief pastor, would baptize if such was scheduled when he is present (otherwise other clergy would officiate) and always celebrate the Eucharist when visiting a congregation for any occasion. Churches which have held this or similar theological and historic commitments are: the Roman Catholic Church: the Orthodox Churches; the Old Catholic Churches of the Union of Utrecht (Europe); the Philippine Independent Church, the Mar Thoma Church (India); and the merged Churches of North India, South India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

Contemporary Recognition: Beginning in 2001, after years of conversation, prayer and study we began receiving rather than confirming persons from Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). We now have what is known as "Full Communion" with the ELCA. Both churches have formally acknowledged the theological compatibility of ministries, including bishops. Going forward from 2001, newly ordained Lutheran Bishops would include the laying on of hands by Episcopal Bishops to receive that sign of historic ordination. Additionally, ordination of Lutheran pastors would generally include a Lutheran bishop (the norm in many Lutheran churches was for pastors to ordain). Lutheran bishops are also invited to lay-on hands at Episcopal consecrations. Also, the Episcopal Church, as an act of goodwill,

"grandfathered" previously ordained bishops and pastors in this period of transition to full historic ordination. For this reasons we "receive" Lutherans with material evidence of confirmation in their tradition. After much prayerful conversation and study, a similar understanding has been reached with the Moravian Church. After both their Northern and Southern Provinces confirm the final agreement (as we did at our 2009 General Convention) we will also receive persons from the Moravian Church.

Current Discussions: We are currently in relatively early conversations with the United Methodist Church, African Methodist Churches (A.M.E., A.M.E.Z. and C. M. E.), and the Presbyterian Church. Persons from these churches are not received but are confirmed. Because the theological integrity of these churches and traditions are a bit further apart from our own, the outcome of these conversations may or may not result in Full Communion. However, at the very least, we do expect a deeper understanding and respect for our distinct heritages as Christian bodies, closer ecumenical fellowship, and, most of all, commitment to specific areas of mutual mission.
