FROM THE DESK OF..... BISHOP NATHAN BAXTER

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

Have you read the Eucharistic Advent lessons? My, are they challenging. The readings chosen are in many ways "apocalyptic"; calling us to see what has been hidden but is now clearly and undeniable the political and spiritual realities in which we live. While the lessons were specifically written for a people in crisis during a particular time in history, the power of scripture is that the human condition, the consequences of our sins and God's intervention is an everlasting cycle---appearing generation after generation.

During the season of Advent, we will be presenting a series of podcasts that look at some of the issues in our society and culture today, in light of the Advent lessons. I would invite you to go to our website at www.diocesecpa.org, and click on the podcast link. Each

Advent I and II will address the issues, both practical and spiritual, of Marcellus Shale. Advent III will address the issues surrounding the "Occupy" movement and Advent IV will address the Tea Party movement.
