FROM THE DESK OF..... BISHOP NATHAN BAXTER

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

This week I did my annual "Saint Nicholas" visit with the students of Saint Stephen's School, Harrisburg. It's always fun to interact with these bright and precocious children as one never knows what wonderful things will happen, especially given their anxious excitement anticipating Christmas. This year I focused on Nicholas as a bishop of a Cathedral. We talked about how a caring bishop might help children of his church in caring for other children in need. I was particularly impressed that a project in the school focused on the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank and their concern for children in need and their families. I then asked, somewhat in passing, what personally excited them most about Christmas, hoping to hear what they expected for Christmas; and hoping to share that I too hoped for nice gifts under the tree. Hands shot up and I picked a little boy whose big anticipatory grin matched mine. He blurted out "I look forward to celebrating Jesus' birth!" I was surprised by his statement and his spontaneity and I muddled something about that being true but what about gifts. As I tried to regroup my thoughts, another child said aloud, "Jesus is the reason for the season". Others chimed in the little jiggle. Then there was lively laughter around the cathedral nave that the bishop had been caught off guard. And I couldn't help but laugh with them!

I have no question that these children were anticipating gifts, big meals, gatherings of family and friends. But I also realized in that moment how easy it is to assume that children nurtured in the faith aren't being religiously formed---the assumption that affirming secular ideas enhances our rapport with them. We should assume that formation is happening as our children experience religious education classes, share in the liturgical rhythms of worship, and interact with the art and symbols of our faith. The message to me this Saint Nicholas Day was to remember that the children under my spiritual care assume, even expect, that their bishop's foremost assumption is that holidays are Holy Days. So, pray this Advent that your bishop will keep focused on the spiritual truth of the season. For while there may be more articulate ways of saying it, "Jesus IS the reason for the season".

Shelter from the Stormy Blast: Theological Reflections on The Events of 9/11 A "Faith in Focus" Prayer Breakfast At St. John's, Bellefonte

The Rev. Dr. Stuart Hoke, former Missioner to St. Paul's Chapel and Assistant to the Rector of Trinity, Wall Street, will be at St. John's, Bellefonte, on Saturday, January 7, 2012 to present "Shelter from the Stormy Blast: Theological Reflections on the Events of 9/11." Father Hoke was leading a service in Trinity Church, Wall Street, while the World Trade Center was crumbling just a few blocks away. After helping to evacuate Trinity's pre-school and the staff from the Trinity office building, he was forcibly evacuated to Staten Island. As Missioner to St. Paul's Chapel (a nearby mission of Trinity Church), he helped transform the space into a place of respite and refreshment for rescue workers and the police and fire departments as they worked at Ground Zero for months following the attacks.

Hear in depth what it was like to be caught up in the extraordinary events of that day from someone who lived it, and who was able to find grace in the midst of so much horror.

Father Hoke served as rector of parishes in Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas. He received his Th.D. from General Seminary in 2000, where he later served as interim Chaplain. Now retired, he does supply work, and teaches a course on 12-step recovery each fall at General Seminary. He lives in North Carolina and has two grown sons.
