Dear Sisters,

Lent. Over the years of my Christian life, I have seen Christians approach Lent in many ways. Some see it as a time of sacrifice, others a time of penitence. Christ saw it as a necessary journey to experience on His way to be with His Father.

From Kathy Rippeon:

Some of our Daughters of Glory at St. Andrew's in the Valley and some of our Episcopal Church Women (ECW) have many talented individuals who like to sew, cut, iron, pin, make tea and serve it and be together in fellowship. Our group consists of DOK and ECW members or anyone who wants to join us for the mission project we happen to be doing. Every 2nd Wednesday of the month we gather to work on a sewing project.

Last year we made prayer quilts and started making dresses to be taken by our missionary friend, Wendy Sikora, to a malnutrition clinic in Haiti for young girls. These children stay at the clinic until they have regained enough nutrition and strength to return home. While at the clinic, they are cared for by the Missionaries of Charity founded by Mother Teresa. Wendy travels to Haiti several times a year to volunteer and take supplies to the clinic. The sisters who take care of the children at the clinic are the ones who requested dresses for the children. The first dresses were all made from the same material in two sizes so the girls would look alike on Easter Sunday 2018 when they first wore them; then they became every-day clothes. Then we made dresses for the girls to wear home — all made from colorful fabric of varying types. We kept the same pattern ... a basic jumper with buttons. The dresses we just completed also have bows.

We were able to send 75 dresses with Wendy in 2018, and we just finished another 45 dresses this week. Wendy lives in Cleveland Ohio and will be coming to visit us in the very near future. Father Nelson will bless the dresses at the 10 AM service and pray for Wendy, the Missionaries of Charity and the welfare and healing of the children they are for each day. Special recognition is given to Carol Bickel, Betsy Howell, Carole Dembosky, Shirley Comiskey and Renee Jones who attended almost every sewing day. Kudos to all of you for your consistent effort in meeting our project goal.

Another project is in the works thanks to our Royal Cross publication.
